
The open landscape along a monumental avenue between Vriezenveen and Almelo forms the scenery of this house. The house is just like the historic farms on the Weitemansweg organized in length. The contours of the connected volumes are here brought together in one sculptural house. The house is extended by pushing two volumes away from each other. One directing the front and one directing the back of the volume. This creates the environment for the characteristic silhouette of separate volumes.


This house enters the long lines of the landscape. The black zinc of the façade is applied in long horizontal folded seams. The shine and blistering of the materials makes the house react subtle on the colors of the Dutch skies. Through the dark subdued color the house enters into the landscape more than the big farmhouses with their orange roofs.

The rooms in the house are like large windows directing on the surrounding area. Each room has a strong focus on one of the wind directions. Only the kitchen is multi-oriented and serves as the hub of the house. From this central space, all rooms (sometimes via open stairs) are in reach. The main structure consists of three steel portals with two laminated beams of one meter high and twenty-seven meters long! In combinations with timber walls, overhangs in multiple directions could be made.
















- 1 Living room
